Friends of the African Union San Diego Proposal - Partnership for Sustainable Communities

On July 4th FAU San Diego will create the FAU Partnership for Sustainable Communities Project. Here we will began the process of developing Plan San Diego based on work developed by the Small Business Administration, the State Department, the Department of Defense, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) brought together under in a proposal to The White House Office of American Innovation in a community collaboration that joins together to help create more livable communities by creating the Greater San Diego Partnership for Sustainable Communities by September 1 2017. Currently we will develop with seven Livability Principles to guide our work:

1. Provide more transportation choices. Develop safe, reliable, and economical transportation choices to decrease household transportation costs, reduce our nation's dependence on foreign oil, improve air quality, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and promote public health.
2. Promote equitable, affordable housing. Expand location- and energy-efficient housing choices for people of all ages, incomes, races, and ethnicities to increase mobility and lower the combined cost of housing and transportation.
3. Enhance economic competitiveness. Improve economic competitiveness through reliable and timely access to employment centers, educational opportunities, services and other basic needs by workers, as well as expanded business access to markets.
4. Support existing communities. Target federal funding toward existing communities—through strategies like transit-oriented, mixed-use development and land recycling—to increase community revitalization and the efficiency of public works investments and safeguard rural landscapes.
5. Coordinate and leverage federal policies and investment. Align federal policies and funding to remove barriers to collaboration, leverage funding, and increase the accountability and effectiveness of all levels of government to plan for future growth, including making smart energy choices such as locally generated renewable energy.
6. Value communities and neighborhoods. Enhance the unique characteristics of all communities by investing in healthy, safe, and walkable neighborhoods—rural, urban, or suburban.
7. **FAU Partnership for Sustainable Communities will lead People of African Descent in creating a coalition that will include at least 20,000 resident households of greater San Diego with at least 1,000 of their businesses and 300 other non profits and faith based groups.**







BUREAUS & CHAPTERS INFORMATIONAL SUMMARY

FAU Bureaus are national organizations organized by 2 or more citizens of that country. They are incorporated per the laws of that country. Each country shall have an assembly of state chapters and that assembly may have representative groups for Capital Cities that are not states, Women, Men, Youth, Elders, People with Disabilities, Veterans, Military, Foreign Government Service Employees and the people who are not in the country and are of the African Diaspora.

FAU State Chapters are organized around the national governmentally recognized states and Capital Cities that are not states. Each Shall have its Annual Assembly in which all Chapters in the state shall be entitled to send a naturally born Male and Female member to vote on resolutions of action.

FAU County Chapters are political and geographic subdivision of a state in the USA

FAU Regional Chapters are political and geographic subdivision in other than the USA and may be metropolitan statistical area (MSA) in the USA. MSA's is a geographical region with a relatively high population density at its core and close economic ties throughout the area.

FAU Metropolitan Chapters are organized around a city inclusive of its surrounding areas that has more than a million people

FAU City Chapters are organized around a city exclusive of its surrounding areas that has more than a 300,000 people

FAU Neighborhood Chapters are within a FAU Metropolitan or City Chapters that has over 1,000 or more members of FAU who live in proximity to each other.

FAU New American Rites of Passage shall be created for each city, metropolitan, county or state FAU chapter and made up of members of the people of the African Union and their allies.

FAU College and University Chapters shall be for each institution and made up of members of the people of the African Union and their allies.

FAU School Chapters shall be for each institution and made up of members of the people of the African Union and their allies.

FAU Affiliated Organization Chapters shall be for each organization which has formally aligned with FAU and made up of members of the people of the African Union and their allies.

FAU Prison and or Jail Chapters shall be for each institution and made up of members of the people of the African Union.


The FAU has taken on, of its own accord since 16 January 2012, the responsibility to organize this African American civil society in the USA based on those actions and on the following 10 principals to be confirmed on 16 November 2012. The proposed 10 operating principals of the Friends of the African Union are:

- (1) We support the African Union [AU], it's constitutive act and the history of the predecessor organization the Organization of African Unity [OAU].
- (2) We support the recognition of the African Diaspora globally and legally by the AU.
- (3) We support the UN Declaration on Human Rights and its application to Africans and their condition worldwide.
- (4) We support the UN Millennium Goals for Africa and the economic-social uplift of Africans on the continent and in the African Diaspora as well work of the African Union in regards to increasing trade between African Nations and will incorporate the work of the International Year for People of African Descent [2011] as it was designated by the UN and Organization of American States.
- (5) We support the strategy and agenda of the Economic Social and Cultural Council [ECOSOC] and through organization of African American Civil Society we support the legacy projects and continuing efforts to strengthen the Global African Diaspora Initiative of the AU.
- (6) We support Peace, Security and basic human dignity within Africa and around the globe, with a emphasis on stopping slavery in the AU and the African Diaspora.
- (7) We support the organization of African and peoples of African decent self interest and uplift through a committee structure and take responsibility for organizing such in the United States of America.
- (8) We support the African Growth and Opportunity Act [AGOA] of 2000 and by 2014 the creation of a new plan between the United States of America and the African Union that is supportive of the African Diaspora in the USA and would be sustainable not only in Africa but also in the host countries of the African Diaspora.
- (9) We support political empowerment of Africans as individual citizens and in free associations on cooperation and solidarity in the continent and in Diaspora.
- (10) We support the creation of the African American Diaspora Holding Company & Investment Trust who will start with creating a financial solution in response to the damage caused by Hurricane Sandy through the US Federal Reserve and its banks.



On the occasion of the 150th anniversary of legal enforcement of US Emancipation at midnight on January 1, 1863, the elders and advocates of the Leimert Park Community in Los Angeles have resolved to become the lead organizers of a seven year campaign called the **Kwanzaa Accord** to promote atonement, reconciliation and redemption of America's "original sin" of chattel slavery using the precepts of the annual **Kwanzaa Festival**.

The **Kwanzaa Accord** is inspired by the biblical story of Joseph who foresaw seven years of plenty followed by years of famine, with the exception that the present state of human affairs is reversed - with seven years of sacrifice to be followed by seven years of recovery.

The campaign will be punctuated with the global commemoration of the 400 year anniversary of the first arrival of African slaves at Virginia in 1619.

The campaign will ensure that **Kwanzaa** and the Seven Principles (Nguzo Saba) embodied in it, will be celebrated throughout the year, starting with a "Good Luck Almanac" (nicknamed the "Bahati Saba") that divides the western calendar into the seven themes of **Kwanzaa** as a means of benchmarking collective activities regardless of religious, cultural or social differences.

Each theme is extended over a seven week period, leaving a surplus of 3 shoulder weeks for Christmas, **Kwanzaa** and New Beginnings.

This African Value System shall serve as the foundational Principles of Unity, around which our Pan African Community can be mobilized to achieve our collective Renaissance Goals, in this **International Decade for People of African Descent**.

The **Kwanzaa Accord** is designed to restore the primacy of the permacultural sciences that fueled the rebirth of modern civilization and were perverted by the Atlantic slave trade to promote the ideology of racial subjugation. The **Good Luck Almanac** will serve as a central clearinghouse for holistic, self-help programs that promote the restoration of a common agenda for wealth creation and sharing in the post-industrial era.

Ambassador AJ Gombey represents "The African Child in All of Us" in truth and fact, as the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has designated the province including Gauteng, South Africa as "The Cradle of Humankind"

Signatories to this **Kwanzaa Accord** agree to practice and demonstrate "Unity in the Community World Vibe, By Fighting With Peace Not For It" through Collaborative Arts and Technology that advocate and transcend the United Nations Millennium Development Goals to include the Universal Declaration of Human Rights as a common standard of achievement for all peoples and all nations in compliance with the United Nations Global Compact.

The African Dollar will be built on a system that is intended to be a very broad programming platform where a FAU Chamber of Commerce member acting as a developer can build games, financial applications, gambling apps, insurance products, social networks, and pretty much everything we already use today.

However, as a currency platform it will be gold backed and is to be run off a decentralized system with a shared ledger system based on a fork of Blockchain technology with embedded MDi/GLINC solutions that make the system what we will call ULTRA SECURE.

The FAU Global African American Stimulus Plan will use the African Dollar System so as to provide African Dollar ULTRA SECURE Payment Solutions at a million locations by 2020. We would start in 20 states with the \$62.6 in established Bank Community Benefit Agreements.



FIFTH THIRD BANK

Fifth Third Bank made on November 18th 2016 with NCRC and allies like FAU & FAU Chamber a \$30 billion Community Benefit Agreement (CBA) commitment for the years 2016 through 2020. The commitment in lending, investments and services is focused on serving low- and moderate-income communities and individuals, and was designed to help Fifth Third Bank fulfill its Purpose to improve lives and be a force for positive change within its geographic footprint.

The above picture is of the November 18th public signing of the **NCRC lead \$30B Community Benefits Agreement** which includes the following:

- ❑ Fund \$11 billion in mortgage lending to LMI individuals and communities.
- ❑ Fund \$10 billion in small business lending in all markets and communities to businesses with gross annual revenue below \$1 million.
- ❑ Fund \$9 billion in Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) community development loans and investments. This includes support for affordable housing, revolving loan funds, Community Development Corporations, Community Development Financial Institutions, community pre-development resources, housing rehab loan pools, and community land trusts and land banks.
- ❑ Fund \$93 million in philanthropy. Work to ensure adequate access to bank branches in LMI communities and communities of color, including opening at least 10 new branches.

The FAU Chamber of Commerce is a NCRC member who has planned a multi year multi billion dollar program in response to the 5th Third Bank CBA including a Public Private Partnership (P3) which includes buying the metropolitan sewer district so as to create decades of jobs in the city - Peace In The Hood, Jobs In The Hood the #BlackFolksPlan.

May 20th 2016 Huntington Bank and National Community Reinvestment Coalition Announced a \$16.1 Billion Community Development Plan that starts in 2017

"The Huntington Bank community benefits agreement is a recognition of the importance of reinvesting in low-income communities," said Nate Coffman, Executive Director of Ohio CDC Association. "Their commitment is a strong step forward to address the challenges in underserved neighborhoods. Huntington's comprehensive approach that ranges from increasing capital and mortgages in low-income communities, to support for housing counseling, to bolstering partnerships with CDCs and community groups is a blueprint to comprehensive investment."

"With the merger of FirstMerit into Huntington, we think it is important to share our intentions in continuing to provide exceptional support and service to the communities where we live and work," said Stephen D. Steinour, chairman, president and chief executive officer of Huntington with \$72B in assets and owns Huntington Preferred Capital, Inc. a Real Estate Investment Trust (REIT).

"The Huntington Bank agreement is going to help to rebuild Cincinnati's minority neighborhoods which have been devastated by foreclosures and by lack of capital investment in these neighborhoods and small businesses," said Barbara Busch, Executive Director of Working In Neighborhoods. "Through this agreement Huntington Bank has committed to provide Cincinnati with access to mortgage loans for minority borrowers. This can only be done through solid partnership with trusted nonprofits like NCRC and Working In Neighborhoods."

- The Community Development Plan will:**
- Fund \$5.7 billion in single-family mortgage lending in low- to moderate-income areas.
 - Fund \$6.6 billion in small business lending including within low- to moderate-income areas.
 - Fund \$3.7 billion in community development lending and investment targeting affordable housing access and community-based loan funds.
 - Fund \$25 million of additional grants and philanthropy primarily targeting housing and small business credit service access.
 - Create \$30 million in further economic impact through support including new branch locations within low- to moderate-income areas and/or majority minority areas; the addition of dedicated community mortgage loan officers; and the formation of a dedicated mortgage processing team to handle unique underwriting opportunities.

Washington, DC - the National Community Reinvestment Coalition (NCRC) and KeyBank's signed a landmark \$16.5 billion Community Benefits Agreement (CBA). The commitment, signed at the 2016 NCRC Annual Conference (see below picture). KeyCorp's Chairman and CEO Beth Mooney and NCRC's President and CEO John Taylor were joined at the signing by community leaders from New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Oregon, and Maine. The commitment includes mortgage, small business, and community development lending, and philanthropy in low- and moderate-income (LMI) communities. It will be carried out over five years, beginning in 2017. FAU will use the \$3M Commitment in the CBA to create in Cleveland a International Trade Center with the African Dollar used in the #BlackFolksPlan for more info <http://friendsoftheafricanunion.com>.

Under the Community Benefits Agreement, KeyBank will lend or invest \$16.5 billion in low- and moderate-income (LMI) communities over a five-year period of time, beginning January 1, 2017. \$16.5 billion is 12% of KeyBank's total combined assets, or 16% of its deposits. KeyBank expects to invest up to 35% of that amount in the First Niagara/KeyBank footprint.

Mortgage Lending to Low- and Moderate-Income Communities

Community Benefits Commitment: **\$5.0 billion over 5 years**

KeyBank will increase mortgage lending in low- and moderate-income communities by \$2.5 billion or 100% over the current rate of both institutions. Each market, including each of the First Niagara markets, should expect up to an average of a 20% compounded growth rate over the five-year period.

Small Business Lending to Low- and Moderate-Income Communities

Community Benefits Commitment: **\$2.5 billion over 5 years**

KeyBank will increase small business lending in LMI communities over the five-year period by \$600 million, or 32% its current rate. KeyBank will expand investments in local and regional Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) that provide micro-lending to micro-enterprises, products and services in the LMI community to support loan pools, EQ2 investing, and grants for technical assistance.

Community Development Lending and Investment (CDLI)

Community Benefits Commitment: **\$8.8 billion over 5 years**

KeyBank will devote \$8.8 billion over five years to community development investments and lending, an increase of \$4.5 billion over its current rate, or over 100%. KeyBank will work with non-profit developers who serve low-income clients and would expect to invest in permanent supportive housing, housing for the elderly, special needs, seniors, workforce housing, and veterans.



Philanthropy

Community Benefits Commitment:

\$175 million over 5 years

The KeyBank Foundation will disseminate \$35 million per year in grants for the period of five years. The five-year total of \$175 million represents an increase of \$85 million or nearly 100%. The bank will also create a new pillar of philanthropy, called "Neighbors," to which \$14 million per year will be devoted to support a broad range of housing and community development activities.

Marketing and Communication

KeyBank will commit \$5 million annually, in marketing and communications resources, to engage in outreach to inform communities about KeyBank's mortgage, small business and community development lending products covered under the plan.

Payday Lending

KeyBank will cease financing CASH America's payday lending activity and wind down that client relationship as quickly as reasonably possible.

Branch Distribution and Access

Of a total of 27 LMI branches within one mile of each other that KeyBank considered closing, 13 were originally slated to be consolidated. Based on NCRC's membership feedback, four of those 13 LMI branches will not be closed. Additionally, a new branch will be opened in an LMI census tract in East Buffalo.

Product Innovation

KeyBank has set a goal to create a product innovation fund of up to \$3 million to test and pilot new products. Such activities and products include, but are not limited to, evaluating opportunities to work with nonprofit organizations able to provide mortgages under \$50,000 and creating lease-to-own programs in New York and Ohio.

Plan Governance

KeyBank will develop a National Advisory Council to monitor and review the plan. NCRC will appoint 50% of the Advisory Council representatives. The Council will review and provide feedback to KeyBank about the performance of the Plan.

Rural Markets

KeyBank will focus on lending and investing in rural areas, especially in geographies such as Alaska, Maine, upstate New York, Ohio, Oregon, and the Rocky Mountains.

Public Benefit Corporations (PBC) expand the obligations of boards, requiring them to consider environmental and social factors, as well as the financial interests of shareholders. This gives directors and officers the legal protection to pursue a mission and consider the impact their business has on society and the environment.

In the United States, directors of for-profit companies are required to act solely for the ultimate purpose of maximizing the financial returns to shareholders. While corporations generally have the ability to engage in any legal activities, including those that are socially responsible, corporate decision-making must be justified in terms of creating shareholder value. Mission driven and other socially conscious businesses, impact investors and social entrepreneurs are constrained by this inflexible legal framework that does not accommodate for-profit entities whose mission and impact is central to their business model.


