This high-level Education Dialogue will explore strategies to overcome the barriers which keep children and young people from accessing a quality education and achieving their potential. Speakers will share their experiences of ensuring equity and inclusion in education, through policies and programmes.

16:00 – 17:30 EDUCATION DIALOGUE: IMPROVED AND MORE EQUITABLE LEARNING OUTCOMES

This high-level event will bring together experts in the field of learning – from Ministers of Education to teachers' representatives – to share their vision of a quality education, and how education systems need to change to improve learning outcomes for all children. Across both panels, speakers will share their experiences of policies and programs that help improve and build more equitable learning outcomes.

- The first panel will be a discussion on the knowledge and skills needed by learners for this time of rapid economic and social change. What learning outcomes are needed to meet the challenges of the 21st century and the demands of the changing global economy, including foundational, socio-emotional and life skills? How do we provide these, and ensure learning outcomes are achieved?
