They are the victims of the racist massacre at a Buffalo, New York, supermarket have been identified and their ages range from 32 to 86.

Self-avowed white racist Payton Gendron allegedly put together a 180-page manifesto that revealed his hatred for Black and Jewish people and the “replacement theory” ideology that Fox News often speaks of, notably hosts Tucker Carlson and Laura Ingraham.

The main work is based around the Friends of the African Union Economic Development Corporation Daniels IDIQ Revenue Anticipation Note for Governments (FAU IDIQ) that is to be licensed to a public private partnership that would involve governments in the United States of America (USA), the African Union (AU), Organization of American States (OAS), The Caribbean Community (CARICOM), and the Organization of African, Caribbean and Pacific States (OACPS) as well as those in the G-7, European Union, Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) and the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) based on a superset of the \$5T USD reparations plan of action Queen Mother Dr. Blakely carried to the third round of the United Nations Financing for Development as a guest of the International Chamber of Commerce, the \$510B in US Federal Reserve bank based community benefit agreements created by the National Community Reinvestment Coalition and its members like ends of the African Union who is signature to \$118B of them, a superset of ISO26000:2010 and using US Presidential Executive Order 13985 through the actions of the US Government in a update to our submission December 3rd 2020 to the WGEPAD public 27th session, entitled “The Urgency of Now: Systemic Racism and the Lessons of 2020”.

We started this work this year by recognizing and commending President of Republic H.E. Alassane Ouattara, President of the Republic of Cote Ivoire for the proposal that nutrition is endorsed, as the theme of the African Union for 2022.

The commemoration of 2022 as the year of nutrition, is welcome given that the Assembly of the Union has been seized with the subject of nutrition since the days of its parent organization the Organization of African Unity. The progress that has been over the years in addressing malnutrition and improving food security across the continent is duly recognized. Further the exceptional leadership of His Majesty King Letsie III of the Kingdom of Lesotho, and AU Champion for that has kept nutrition high on the policy agenda of member states.

The decision of the Assembly on the choice of nutrition, as the theme of the year is taking place in a difficult context as member states remain challenged by the COVID-19 Pandemic that is affecting our populations and their livelihoods, especially in the areas of nutrition and food security and the challenge the world has faced in 2022 with the Russian invasion of Ukraine as supply chains in the world has taken another turn with the sanctions. created by a 30-nation coalition to enforce them on Russia.

The AU theme of year for 2022 aims to maintain a strong political momentum on nutrition across the African continent and this month from May 3rd to May 27th the UN has been seized by the issue in the USG African Dialogue Series of 2022 in which we are participating. It is our belief that World Conference of Mayors Collaboration Conference offers a unique opportunity to connect the AU and its members to the economy of the State of California which is the largest in the United States, with a \$3.4 trillion gross state product (GSP) as of 2021. We look that the objective is to strengthen continental commitment to end malnutrition in all its forms and to further improve food and security through the implementation of Malabo Commitments and the goals and objectives of the Africa Regional Nutrition Strategy (2016-2025).

This World Conference of Mayors Collaboration Conference is a great opportunity for all the stakeholders including all African Union Members, Regional Economic Communities, and Civil Society Organizations to organize in the State of California during the World Conference of Mayors Collaboration Conference with the private sectors, UN and partners, to use the opportunity, to secure greater political commitment and investment in nutrition and to address the ongoing nutrition and food security challenges.

We do this work in the belief that blended finance can play a role but needs to focus on where it can add the most value. We will organize civil society sector in the United States of America to meet the challenge posed by United Nations General Assembly resolution A/RES/76/266 in its "global call for concrete action for the elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and the comprehensive implementation of and follow-up to the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action"

The solution will include crucial support for non-concessional official lending in support of commercial finance through the framework of community benefit agreements. This work rather than relying mostly on conventional concessional finance is based on creating a new global capitalist financial system based a Global Compact to Build Back the World Better with Democracy in a New World Order Version 4.0 with a #JustEconomy that will be presented on June 19th 2022, the historic Juneteenth in the USA.

The Solution is the driven by Daniels IDIQ Revenue Anticipation Note for Government in a FAU EDcorp licensed public private partnerships that is a 75-year solution capitalized with 400 investment groups by July 28th, 2022 in the FAU smartWISE Community Reinvestment Coalition models, with a goal of having 400 in operation in the United States of American (USA) we started operations in Hamilton County, Ohio Washington DC and Los Angeles California in 2019

We released a framework of this plan at the close of the UN Commission on the Status of Women 66th Session as part of a report on our work on the International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade which is a United Nations international observance designated in 2007 to be marked on March 25th of every year. Today we will set in motion a 30-day period of study of it considering the Challenge of Sustainable Development.

We believe that there is sufficient financing for sustainable development is available, given the size, scale, and level of sophistication of the global financial system and the changes over the last 30 days. The world economy, comprising 194 economies, in 2021 is estimated around US\$93.86 trillion according to figures from the International Monetary Fund. This figure is almost \$9.3 trillion more than compared to 2020. Global Gross Domestic Product in terms of Purchasing Power Parity (PPP) is forecasted around \$141.96 trillion, \$10.3 trillion up compared to 2020.

This increase in wealth, mostly in the developed world, came in a world that was hit hard by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, which brought disruption and loss of lives and livelihoods, and made evident that humankind was inextricably connected and yet divided between those who have access to care, services and opportunities and those who are left behind. In the USA the murder of George Floyd caused global human rights advocacy to change in creating an alliance that reshaped American geopolitical influence and politics in the 2020 Presidential Election.

In the USA, with the world's third-largest population, the world of 2020 was devastated and changed by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic. COVID-19 resonates in 2022 around the changes of the pandemic in a national emergency in which we have lost 970,082 as of March 21st, 2022. This in a world loss of 6,077,072 and we may yet not be out of the woods as variants spread and the politics of return to normal embed themselves over the public health concerns.

Today we take note of the opportunity given us on January 20th, 2021, through the USA's Federal Government Executive Order 13985 Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities to address the legacy of the transatlantic slave trade. The African Slave trade was a phenomenon characterized by systematic continuation of mass human trafficking of African people that first started during the seventh century when the Arabs invaded North Africa three times, bringing not just a new religion with a language and customs that were alien to the native Berber tribes of the Sahara and Mediterranean hinterland. By the time of the fourteenth century the degrading economic transactions and unspeakable modern human rights violations had a new market in the transatlantic slave trade. We will never know all the facts and figures but is estimated that there were 14M Africans in the transatlantic slave trade from the 14th to 19th century and over 17M in the Arab African slave trade from the 7th to the 20th century (1962). While two out of every three slaves shipped across the Atlantic were men, the proportions were reversed in the Muslim slave trade in Arab lands and India

with 2 women for every man enslaved. While the mortality rate for slaves being transported across the Atlantic was as high as 10%, the percentage of slaves dying in transit in the Transsahara and East African slave trade it was estimated between 80 and 90%. Thereby we estimate that over 180M Africans have died since the 7th century start of the African slave trade.

A critical committee for us as we come up to commemorate the International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade domestically is a global reparations infrastructure that could serve as the basis for our position in this publication to study our plan of action to create the Global Compact to Build Back the World Better with Democracy in a New World Order with a Just Economy and is based on an email Saturday 7.31.2021 in which we said:

Dear fellow members of the National Coalition of Blacks for Reparations in America.

The Black Folks Plan for Reparative Justice was proposed by the Friends of the African Union and the African Diaspora Directorate as agent on Friday February 19, 2021, to the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Constitution, Civil Rights, and Civil Liberties at the hearing titled: H.R. 40: Exploring the Path to Reparative Justice in America. It is a \$6T USD 75 year (2021-2095) public private partnership solution for the fundamental injustice, cruelty, brutality, and inhumanity of African slavery in the USA between 1789 & 1866 and progenitor 13 British colonies (that became the USA) between 1619 and 1789 that will address the damage incurred by past & current federal government racism against Africans in the U.S.A. from 1862 to 1868 and African Americans from 1868 to 2019.

The #BLACKFOLKSPLAN for #REPARATIVEJUSTICE for a #JUSTECONOMY supports:

- (1.) the creation and support of a law cooperative in support of 75-year agreement to support a get out the vote infrastructure in the USA for citizens of African Descent and that will support Cessation & Non-Repetition of Harm to our American human, civil and economic rights.
- (2.) a fund for Restitution for a life that was stolen from what it could on been due to intergenerational poverty caused by American Apartheid (1868-1965) and then the discrimination and trauma for being a Person of African Descent in the USA (1965-2019);
- (3.) a fund to Compensate the lives of citizens of African Descent who live in poverty with a program that leaves no one behind;
- (4.) a fund for Rehabilitation of citizens of African Descent lives that includes those in need of a pathway for re-entry such as from addiction, poverty. non citizenship or prison; and,
- (5.) a fund for a standing 75-year secretariat to support Satisfaction with our actions based on a global Total Quality Management and Corporate Social Responsibility infrastructure that is based on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and their successors.

Accounting for inflation through 2019, the #BlackFolksPlan, with an interim update on February 4th 2020, if we use the \$20,000 that the Japanese received for 3 years in Concentration Camps (1942-1945), then we asked for funding it would be \$1,114,463.18 per person in 2020 dollars if applied to the 4,660,920 Africans in 1866, at the end of the civil war, August 20 1866.

2022 NOTE: Over the next 30 days we will be confirming and updating this figure.

Then the total amount is \$5,194,423,160,011.97 or \$5.2T with estimated damages of \$800B from 1868 to 2019. This includes the \$120B in black farmer land asset value lost from 1920 to 2018 in a Tufts University study.

We will ask for \$6T in our proposed public private partnership using the Daniels IDIQ (the 2020 Version). This will be a 75-year agreement (2021-2095) in three (3) 25-year periods. In each period we will have 5-year funding commitments with the first 2021-2025.

So now what we propose is that from its start, this civil society coalition be vocal in its support for Black people not only domestically but from around the world, all 1.6B or more. Domestically we are proposing an August 25th through August 28th meeting, in person and online.

Our preferred tool on human and civil rights is the Universal Periodic Review (#UNUPR). It is one I hope we can all agree on. In the second cycle at the State Department, we bowed to the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights as we had not completed examples of our economics-based solution. Now we are partners on \$118B in established federal reserve bank community benefit agreements in the third cycle.

Among our reasoning in use of the #UNUPR is those who want to point out flaws in nations human and civil rights can continue to do so through this mechanism. Those of us involved in economic solutions can use it to provide solutions like we have done for the USA in the second and third cycle along with in the third cycle Mexico and Nigeria. FYI here is what the state department has to say about it for the USA.

In addition, with the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC) is at its strongest position ever with 6 House Chairmanships including Foreign Affairs, Agriculture, Homeland Security and Finance we can be the civil society change needed with a pre COVID domestic GDP of \$1.25T for Black Folk.

With release of this report, we would add working with the Congressional Black Caucus as it is and will continue into 2023 to be a powerful block in the US House of Representatives. The 50-year-old group, which includes most Black members of Congress and is entirely Democratic, along with the President, is also more diverse, reflecting growing pockets of the Black electorate: millennials, progressives, suburban voters, those less tightly moored to the Democratic Party.

It, along with the Congressional Caucus on Black Women & Girls, contains thread of social justice, first civil and voting rights, connects one generation to the next, the influx of new members from varying backgrounds is testing the group's long-held traditions in ways that could alter the future of Black political power in Washington along. The newcomers, shaped by the Black Lives Matter movement rather than the civil rights era, urge Democrats to go on the offensive regarding race and policing, pushing an affirmative message about how to overhaul public safety. They have sought and gotten a bolder strategy on voting rights but have lost out in congressional politics in not being able to compromise. This was shown in the failure of the Build Back Better Act of 2021 and the voting rights strategies they advocated. We will put forth to them an update to our Black Folks Plan in the plan to Build Back the World Better with Democracy in a New World Order with a Just Economy.

We will do so even as many thought perhaps the more significant issue than any ideological or age divide, is the caucus's fault line of political origin stories — between those who made the Democratic establishment work for them and those who had to overcome the establishment to win. Both have missed the significance and opportunity in the United Nations and generational events of change like the August 2nd, 2021, passage of the Permanent Forum of People of African Descent.

According to a New York Time article in 2021, Representative James E. Clyburn of South Carolina, a Democrat, and the most powerful Black lawmaker in the House, said in an interview that the group still functioned as a family. But that family has grown to include people like Representative Cori Bush of Missouri, an outspoken progressive who defeated a caucus member in a hotly contested primary last year, and Representative Lauren Underwood of Illinois, whose district is overwhelmingly white.

"There was not a single member of the caucus, when I got there, that could have gotten elected in a congressional district that was only 4 percent African American," Mr. Clyburn said, referring to Ms. Underwood. "We didn't have people in the caucus before who could stand up and say, 'I know what it's like to live in an automobile or be homeless,'" he said of Ms. Bush, whose recent dayslong sit-in on the Capitol steps pushed President Biden's administration to extend an eviction moratorium.

In 2016, Congresswomen Bonnie Watson Coleman (NJ-12), Robin Kelly (IL-2), and Yvette D. Clarke (NY-09) inspired by the advocacy of the #SheWoke Committee, initiated the Congressional Caucus on Black Women and Girls (CCBWG). Officially established by Congress in the same year, CCBWG seeks to empower and elevate the voices of Black woman and girls throughout the country and advance legislation important to their welfare. We look forward to working with them on our \$1T CSW66 Women's Plan to Build Back the World Better with Democracy in a New World Order with a Just Economy. This action will draw on Executive Order 13985 Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities that addresses both Blacks and women in its broad scope.

The UN Women led event, the HeForShe Summit, on Sept. 23rd, 2021. It was organized against a global landscape where it was estimated that it would take 257 years to achieve economic equality. A world where 90% of all Heads of State and Fortune 500 CEOs are male.

Last year global leaders from across business, non-profit and academia were standing up then and today by joining the UN Women's, then new, HeForShe Alliance. The HeForShe Alliance is a unique group of ambitious leaders, like those us in FAU, determined to accelerate progress towards gender equality. We believed then in 2021 and now at CSW66 that the launch of the HeForShe Alliance signified the beginning of a new era with a commitment to action following in the footsteps of the Generation Equality Forum earlier 2021.

While last September 23rd, 2021, when FAU was fully engaged in the United Nations Food System Summit, and we took note of the action UN Women in New York. We could not get a response from the CBC or CCBWG on either event. We will work to engage the women of the CBC, CCBWG and other women of African Descent in government in the efforts in this document.

As part of the five HeForShe actions that as Chairman of Friends of the African Union I will convene monthly sessions around our plan of action in support of Gender Equality.

In addition, as part of the five HeForShe actions that as Chairman of Friends of the African Union will carry out to Build Back the World Better with Democracy in a New World Order with a Just Economy Gender Equality Actions that can be summarized as in the following 5 points of action:

(1) Publishing today at the end of CSW66 a solution framework for concrete action for the elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and a plan of action for comprehensive follow-up to the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action. In this we commit to Gender Equality.

(2) Under our HeForShe commitment at CSW66 we also will work to engage the women of the US Congress and government of the United States in these efforts around the twin programs that we will announce at CSW66:

(A) Creating with girls and women of African Descent 1m girls and women majority owned businesses with 100,000 in the USA with a focus on agriculture and food systems, health and social services, construction, STEM (Science Technology Entertainment and Math), FAME (Fashion Arts Music Entertainment), Sports and Recreation and the education.

(B) Ending Female Genital Mutilation by 2030 while empowering women with the tools to own the best health and food systems that can because you are as healthy as what you eat.


