



The 1st Session of the United Nations Permanent Forum on People of African Descent (#PfpAD) took place from 5 to 8 December 2022 in Palais des Nations of the United Nations Office in Geneva, Switzerland.



One of the key components proposed by our Friends of the African Union and the World Conference of Mayors PfpAD Committee delegation headed by Dr. Abdoulaye Mbengue in Geneva was creation of a new civil society organization Friends of the United Nations Permanent Forum of People of African Descent (Friends of the #PfpAD). This work happened as part of an official side event of the session by Zoom on December 8th 2023. Today on MLK Day 2023 it will be creating Parallel Events around the UN PfpAD in the coming years including the 2nd Session at the UN HQ in New York City. It will also operate in the USA as the voice of the 1.6B people of African Descent in connection to those in America who support improving the safety and quality of life and livelihoods of people of African descent and addressing historical wrongs against them. We followed the US African Leaders Summit with civil society partnerships with federal, state, and local governments in the USA stating with an online meeting during the 2022 CAP FAU Kwanzaa Accords Dec 26th through Jan 1st at <http://www.PfpAD.africa>. It is based, in part, on a process solution that builds in the UN Universal Periodic Review process, and operates within the regulatory framework of the United States Federal Reserve System and the African Union using a global superset of the National Community Reinvestment Coalition Community Benefit Agreement #JustEconomy Model and in line with The United States of America strategy on countering corruption pursuant to the United States National Security Study Memorandum-1 and Executive Orders 13360, 13985 and 14089.

On August 2nd 2021 the United Nations voted “.....to establish the Permanent Forum of People of African Descent, which will serve as a consultation mechanism for people of African descent and other interested stakeholders as a platform for improving the quality of life and livelihoods of people of African descent and to contribute to elaborating a United Nations declaration on the promotion and full respect of human rights of people of African descent, and that the modalities, format and substantive and procedural aspects of the Permanent Forum will be concluded by Member States and observer States, with further consultations with people of African descent.....”

Friends of the United Nations Permanent Forum of People of African Descent is launched around it.

Friends of the United Nations Permanent Forum of People of African Descent sponsor Friends of the African Union (FAU) is a member of the National Community Reinvestment Coalition (NCRC), a nonprofit that works to increase the flow of private capital into traditionally underserved communities. With members like FAU NCRC has created with PNC Bank a \$88B Community Benefit Agreement that includes \$26.5 billion for lending to small businesses in communities that are majority people of color and or experiencing LMI. Through the Just Economy Club, operated by NCRC, and Friends of the United Nations Permanent Forum of People of African Descent we plan to connect a global network from the work done with the World Conference of Mayors at the US African Leaders Summit of 2022 based on FAU's work a decade ago at the 1st U.S. Africa Business Conference in Cincinnati Ohio in 2012 hosted by Ambassador Johnnie Carson. Our plan is, as Americans, to not only use the US Government commitments to the African people and African nations through the African Union and bilaterally in a Daniels IDIQ metaverse with licensed networks that are P2P, B2B and C2G. Additionally, as a people of African Descent, we will strengthen ties between us as a globally unified people of African Descent through Africanfuturism in the United Nations (UN) using the newly created UN Permanent Forum of People of African Descent.

FRIENDS OF THE AFRICAN UNION is an economic, social, humanitarian, charitable, educational, STEAM and new media civil society organization founded to work for the benefit of the people of the African Union (AU) and the African diaspora in their host countries.

FAU is organized around the action in 2005, when the AU defined the African Diaspora as "... peoples of African descent and heritage living outside the continent, irrespective of their citizenship, and who remain committed to contribute to the development of the continent and the building of the African Union."

Since 2021 Friends of the African Union (FAU) recognizes that the United Nations Permanent Forum on People of African Descent (PfpAD) is the only worldwide intergovernmental organization to unite and service the needs and aspirations of the more than 1.6 billion African people, globally. FAU supports creation of a civil society organization around the PfpAD.

FAU has supported in the past, starting on its birth on MLK Day January 16th 2012, and in the future from MLK Day 2023 January 16th 2023 the organization of peoples of African descent in the United States of America (USA) to join us in changing the lives of Africans worldwide by our collective action. In doing so we will call on their self-interest as the currently most wealthy group of Africans worldwide, with a \$1.6T 2021 GDP, and as citizens of one of the 14 nations which on February 26, 1885 founded the 20th century African nation states through the General Act of the Conference of Berlin.

FAU Purpose is to support the people of African Descent in creating a unified African world order which includes creating intergenerational wealth for the youths, daughters, sons, mothers, fathers, babies, elders, and all our people worldwide.

FAU Unity is where members of the organization will be able to unite, not only with the people of the African Descent from all over the world that have similar goals, interest, skills, talents, and collective goals but also with allies who support the people of the African Descent in meeting the challenging times before us.

FAU Self-Determination is where a member can take as an active part in the process in which a person controls their own life, as they want, as an member of the global African people— in person or electronically. We encourage members to take a leadership role in the activities of the FAU and make them fully inclusive of peoples with disabilities, women and youth.

FAU Collective Work and Responsibility is centered around private-public partnerships. A member will have the opportunity to take part in making better the present time and the future for our children, youth, women, seniors and people with disabilities by being involved in our private-public partnerships that are planned to make life better for people of African Descent.

FAU's Cooperative Economics creates for each member a personalized partnership with the organizations, not for profit and for profit, that makes each member part of an economic plan that will aid in our people's financial upliftment.

FAU as a Creative Class Coalition encourages members to use their creativity to come up with ideas that will be beneficial to our people, starting with themselves through joint ventures with FAU and standalone ventures.

FAU supports the United Nations (UN) Universal Declaration of Human Rights and its application to people of African Descent and their condition worldwide. In addition, FAU supports Peace, Security and basic human dignity within the member states of the UN, the African Union (AU) and for the people of African Descent in the global African Diaspora as defined by the AU in 2005, with an emphasis on stopping slavery worldwide with a focus on people of African Descent.

FAU supports the continued political empowerment of people of African Descent as individual citizens and in free associations on cooperation and solidarity in the continent and in the global African Diaspora.

We formed Friends of the African Union United States of America Bureau in 2016 in New York state in the USA in order to form a more perfect union between the people of the African Union (AU) and those of the United States of America. It was meant to establish justice and the rule of law equally applied to all people, ensure global tranquility, provide for the common defense of the people of the African Union, promote the general welfare for the people of the African Union, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, did ordain and establish a Constitution for benefit of the people of the African Union in the United States of America in 2016 in a New York for profit company FAU EDCorp, Inc..

FAU supported in the past the creation of a new United Nations Sustainable Development Goal based plan between the United States of America and the African Union. One that is supportive of people of African descent in the USA and would be sustainable not only in Africa but also in the host countries of the African Diaspora. Now we are updating that plan.

In the past Friends of the African Union (FAU) recognized that the African Union, to date, was the only organization which has the structural and functional capacity to unite, and service the needs and aspirations of the more than 1.6 billion African people, globally. This has changed in 2021 after 20 years of work in the United Nations that in 2014 we joined in.

Now that the aspirations of Marcus Garvey and his peers in 20th Century Pan Africanism has been achieved on August 2nd 2021 when in response to United Nations General Assembly resolution A/RES/76/266 which was adopted it at its seventy-sixth session entitled "A global call for concrete action for the elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and the comprehensive implementation of and follow-up to the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action" did the United Nations General Assembly voted to create a Permanent Forum of People of African Descent.

Now FAU believes that it is time, as members of the African family worldwide, to capitalize on our joint skills, contacts and intellectual property to create a solution based on the goal of ending institutionalized governmental racism in the United States of America and implementing a superset of the AU's Africa 2063 and on Dec. 8th 2022 we did start this work through the creation of a new civil society organization to be called Friends of the United Nations Permanent Forum of People of African Descent. Then during the Kwanzaa of 2022, we started with Friends of the African Union during the tenth anniversary with the Congress of African Peoples (CAP/FAU) Kwanzaa Accords by promoting the public online organizing meetings of the over 119 tasks in making operational Friends of the Permanent Forum on People of African Descent.

Now on MLK Day 2023 we do this work around the Dec. 13, 2022, Executive Order 14089 on Establishing the President's Advisory Council on African Diaspora Engagement in the United States issued during the historic US African Leaders Summit of 2022 in Washington DC where our representative was in attendance through strategic relations with allied organizations.

The United Nations Friends of the Permanent Forum of People of African Descent 2023 USA Africa Policy Conference on Business and Civil Society is built on the Executive Order on Establishing the President's Advisory Council on African Diaspora Engagement in the United States through creating a superset of the African Union's Agenda 2063 only now involving the African Diaspora in the USA as the gateway to the US market including the \$1.6T federal government market.
